



Construction Volunteers: Beginning in mid-April, we will be working on 20-25 homes through a mix of new construction, rehabilitation of flood-affected homes, and exterior renovations. Our construction sites operate Tuesday through Saturday from 8am-4pm. No prior experience is required to volunteer, but we are always looking for experienced leadership for our teams. We hope to develop three teams with a special focus on our three project types, new construction, rehabilitations, and exterior renovations, and then have these teams participate regularly through the summer.

Restore Volunteers: The ReStore is a retail facility that recycles overstocked, discontinued, new and used building materials donated by manufacturers, businesses, contractors, and individuals. All income generated by the ReStore go to support local and international Habitat for Humanity building efforts. Volunteers contribute by loading and sorting building materials in our warehouse or can participate in our weekly art classes. The Restore is open Tuesday through Saturday from 9am-5pm

Volunteer Relations: This committee provides assistance to the volunteer program. Members facilitate the volunteer orientations and plan the volunteer recognition events. They also help provide volunteer coordination on the worksite, oversee the volunteer database, and provide volunteer support for special events.

Faith Relations / Development: This committee works to engage local faith communities to facilitate their participation in Habitat projects. The faith community's involvement can consist of sponsorship or co-sponsorship of a house; organizing a congregational workday, making a long-term financial pledge to support our work; advocating in the community for Habitat and for affordable housing; and/or committing to pray for the work of Habitat in the community. This committee guides the overall resource development strategy of the affiliate, incorporating volunteers, money, land, materials, and services. It utilizes representatives of all the other standing committees in order to develop a holistic resource development strategy across the entire organization.

Finance Committee: This committee oversees the budget and finances of the affiliate. They set policy for financial planning and tracking, direct the annual budgeting process, and ensure professionalism, precision, and transparency in our financial statements.

A Brush With Kindness Committee: Members of this committee are responsible for processing ABWK applications, inspecting homes, serving as homeowner advocates, and working with homeowners to determine what repairs can and may be done. This program combines aspects of many of our other committees, and is a opportunity for someone with diverse interests. While a background in construction or family services would be helpful, experience is not required.

Family Support Partner: As a member of the Family Support committee, is committed to carrying out the stated purpose of the committee and Habitat for Humanity. Primarily important is the support the Family Support Partner provides his or her partner family by empowering them through homeownership. The Family Support Partner recognizes the family as part of God's creation and relates to them holistically, respecting the values and individuality of each family member. The Family Support Partner serves as the primary contact between the affiliate and the partner family, providing them with advice and information regarding sweat equity hours, mortgage payments, and homeowner classes.

Gold Team: We are looking for a dedicated team of individuals interested in helping at our construction site outside of the normal labor-intensive role. These volunteers would take on the task of ensuring hospitality to our volunteers on a daily basis and ensuring a quality experience. Our team will be provided tee-shirts, identifying them as site staff. We need help in three areas preparing the site, assisting volunteers, and maintaining safety.



Food Donations: We need donations of food and drinks and help preparing lunches to help keep our volunteers healthy and productive on the job site. Lunches typically include simple sandwiches, and a vegetarian option, bagged with fruit and snacks for groups ranging from 30-50 persons. Lunches can be delivered to our ReStore on Friday or our construction site on Saturday before 11:00. Volunteers should be able to organize making and delivering the lunches themselves for the size of group and dates scheduled with our Volunteer Coordinator.
